Roof Replacement: On September 25th, the finance committee chair, Terry O'Reilly met with the Archdiocese for approval for the replacement of the flat roof at St. Mary's (this includes the rectory, garage, and church plus the sky lights). There were four tenders received and the winning company will be Wolfenburg and the start date will be **Nov 17/19**. The

cost will be \$120,000 plus HST. The parish has \$55,000 invested with the Diocese and will be using that amount plus a loan from the Central Development Fund that the Diocese oversees in the amount of \$75,000. There will be special envelopes in the church for donations towards the roof replacement. There will be more information regarding Mass times once Father Oliver is back.
